1.South (Guangxi)

- sh sounds like s
- frequently adds "long" **a** (啊) sound to the end of certain syllables (esp. common in/around Guangdong)

kàn shū a , dǎ lán qiú a , pá pá shān a 。

看 书啊,打篮球啊,爬爬山啊。

Read books, play basketball and go hiking.

2. North (Heilongjiang)

- frequently adds ér (儿) at the end of certain syllables
- pronounces w almost like an English "v" sound (esp. common in/around Beijing)

wán yí huì ér shǒu jī, kàn yí huì ér diàn yǐng ér, xué yí huì ér xí, dào xià wǔ chī wǎn fàn .

Play around with my cell phone, watch some movies, study a little bit and have dinner in the afternoon.

3. South (Guangzhou)

- ch sounds like c
- sh sounds like s
- frequently adds "long" **a** (啊) sound to the end of certain syllables (esp. common in/around Guangdong)

gēn péng you qù hē chá a , dǎ yǔ máo qiú a , zuò yì xiē jiàn shēn huó dòng a .

跟朋友去喝茶啊,打羽毛球啊,做一些健身活动啊。

Drink tea with my friends, play badminton and work out a little.

4. North (Beijing)

- frequently adds **ér** (儿) at the end of certain syllables

zhèi ge zhōu mò kě néng jiù shì hé péng you liáo liáo tiān **ér**, jiàn gè miàn, rán hòu chī gè 这个周末可能就是和朋友聊聊天儿,见个面,然后吃个fàn。

饭

This weekend, I'll probably chat and meet up with my friends, then have a meal with them.

5. North (Beijing)

- frequently adds ér (儿) at the end of certain syllables
- pronounces **w** almost like an English "v" sound (esp. common in/around Beijing)

hé péng you chū qu wán ér 。

和朋友出去玩儿。

Hang out with friends.
